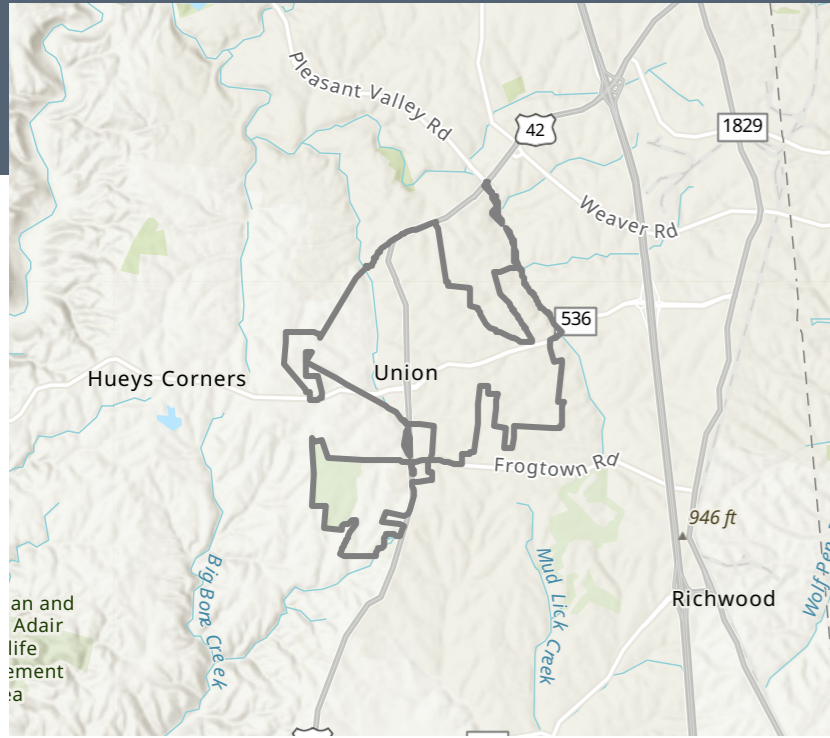

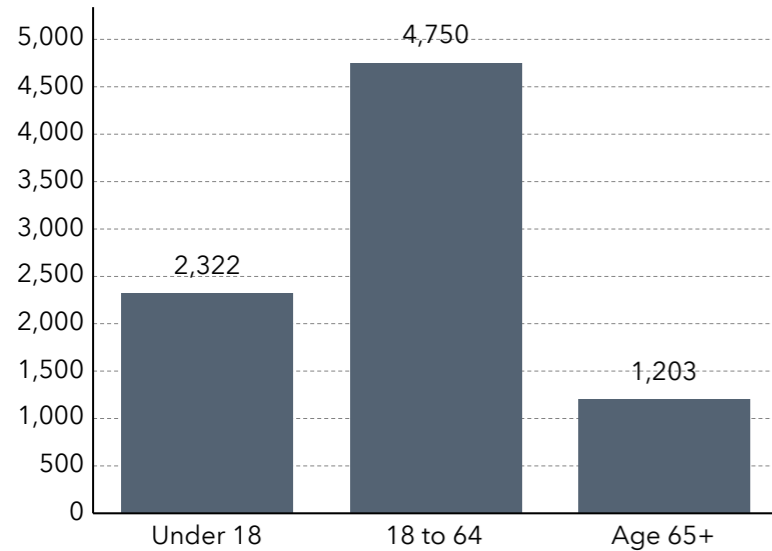

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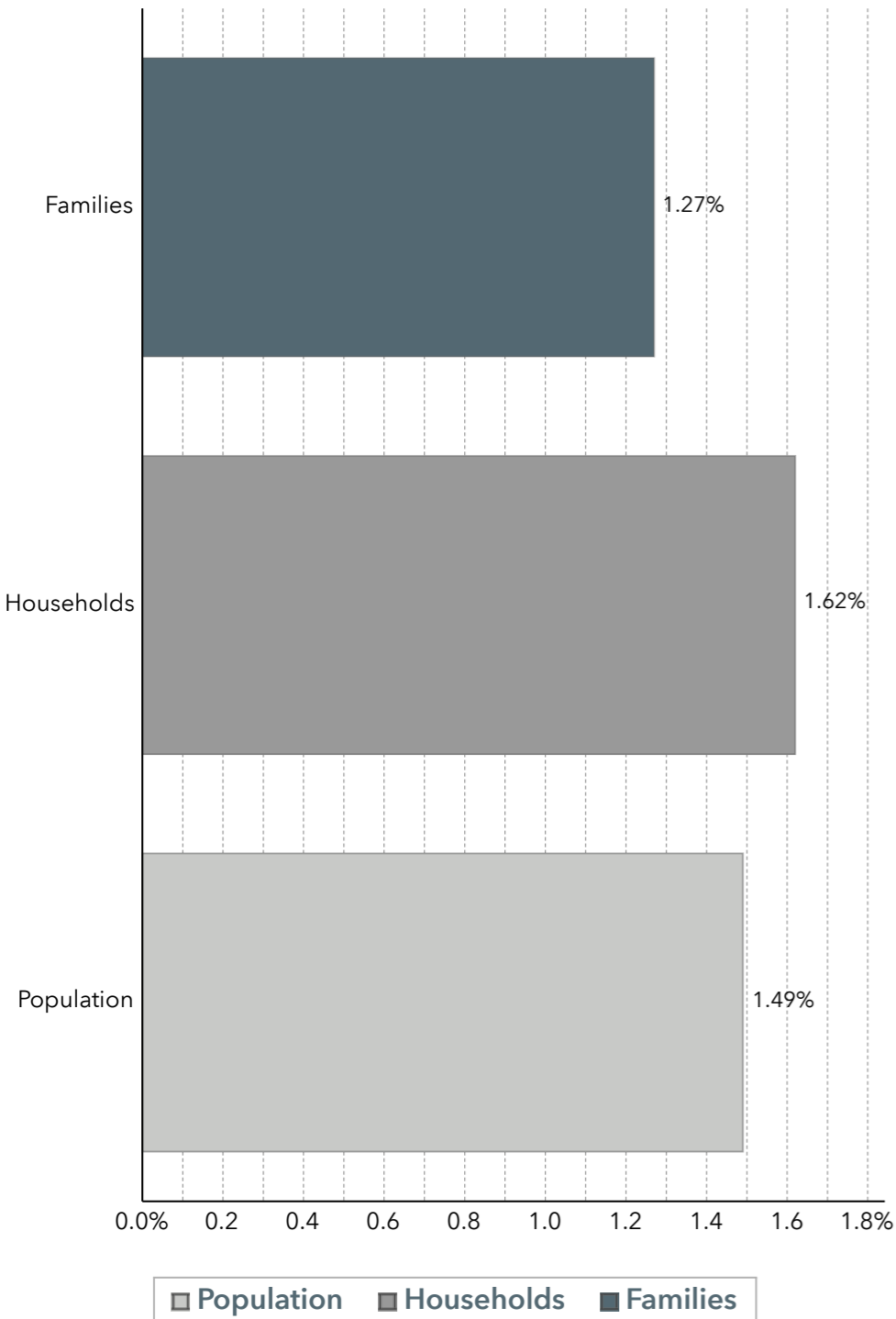
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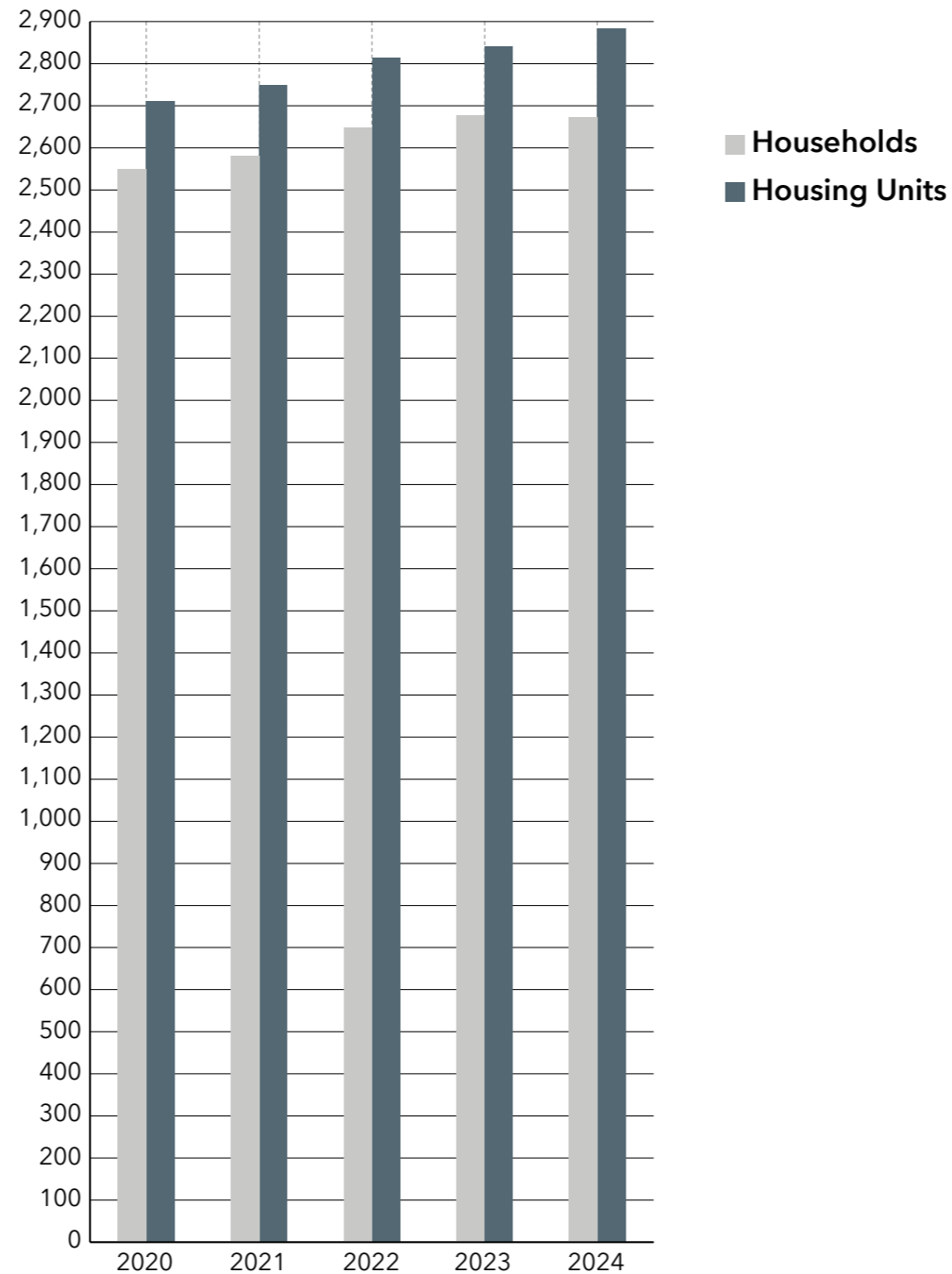
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Forecasted Annual Growth Rate

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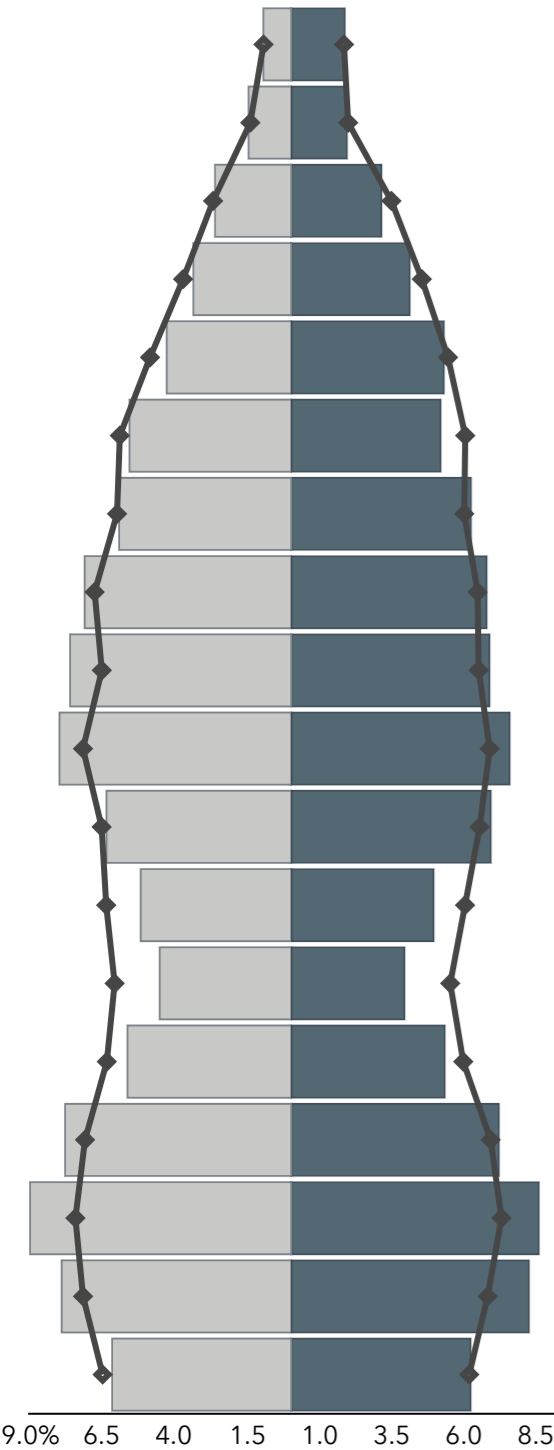
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Age Pyramid

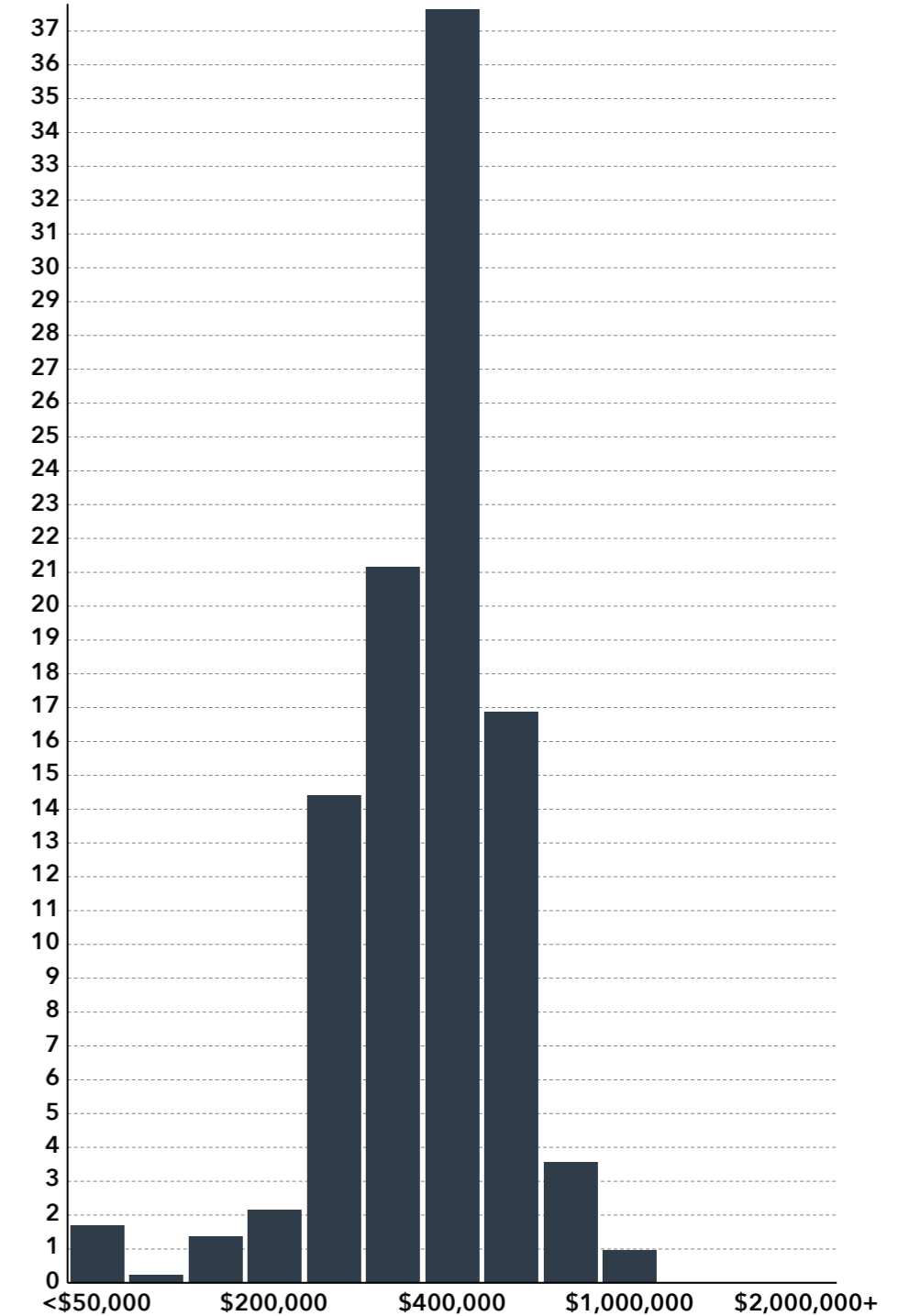

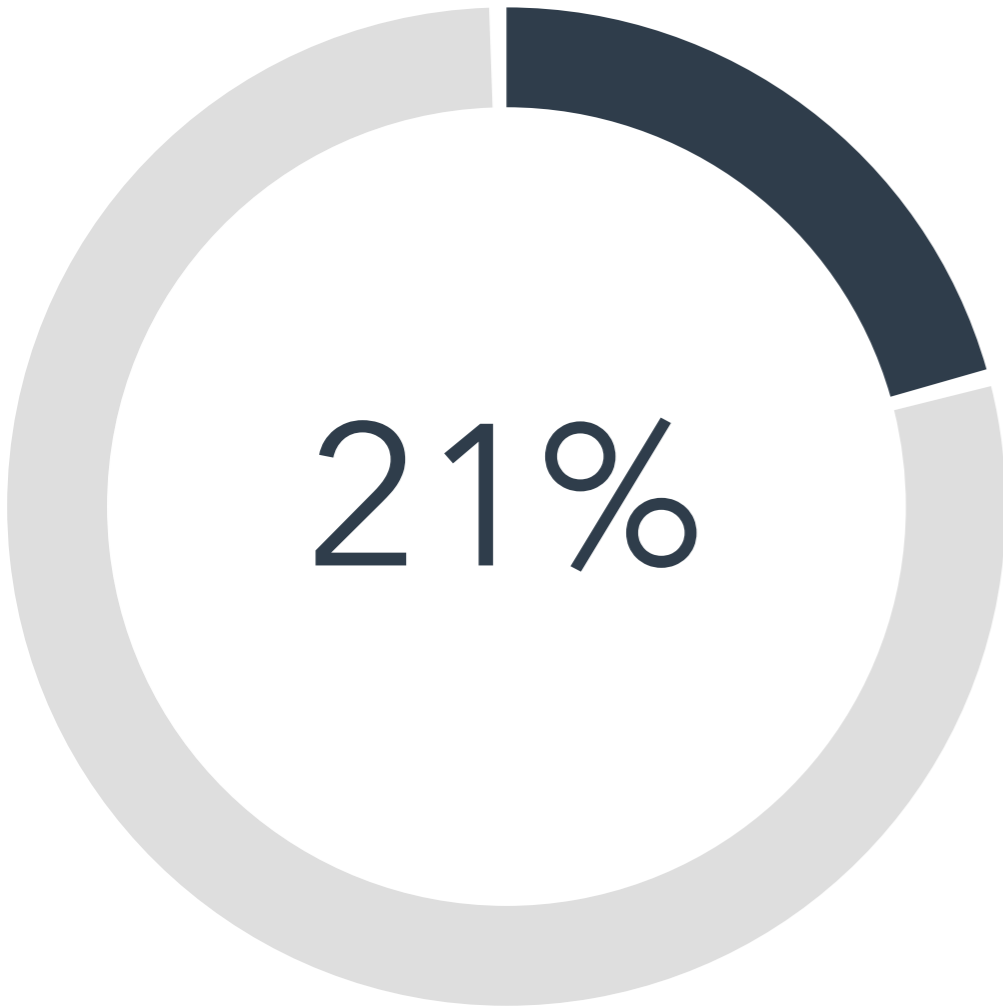

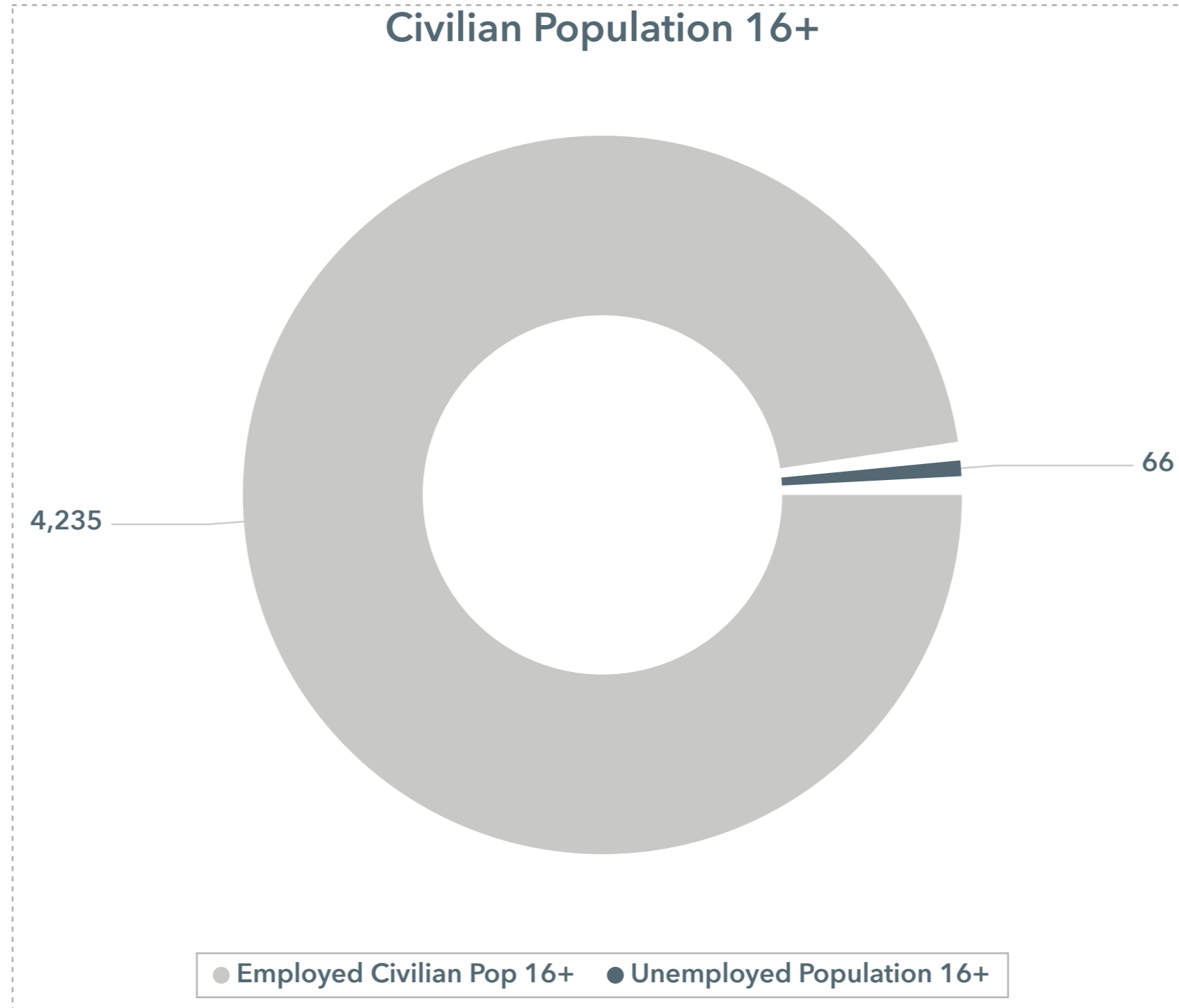


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WEALTH INDEX



Esri's Wealth Index is compiled from a number of indicators of affluence including average household income and average net worth. The concept of wealth is defined by more than just above-average household income. Wealth also includes the value of material possessions and resources. Esri captures both income and the accumulation of substantial wealth, or the abundance of possessions and resources in its identification of the wealthiest areas in the country.

The index represents the wealth of the area relative to the national level. Values exceeding 100 represent above-average wealth.

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HOUSING AFFORDABILITY INDEX



Housing Affordability Index (HAI) has a base of 100, representing an area where the median income is sufficient to qualify for a loan on a home valued at the median home price and not be cost-burdened.

Values greater than 100 indicate increasing affordability. HAI is not applicable in primarily rental areas. HAI is not reported for areas containing 50 or fewer owner-occupied households

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DIVERSITY INDEX



Diversity Index summarizes racial and ethnic diversity. The index shows the likelihood that two persons, chosen at random from the same area, belong to different race or ethnic groups.

The index ranges from 0 (no diversity) to 100 (complete diversity). For example, if an area's entire population belongs to one race or ethnic group, then an area has zero diversity. An area's diversity index increases to 100 when the population is evenly divided into two or more race/ethnic groups.

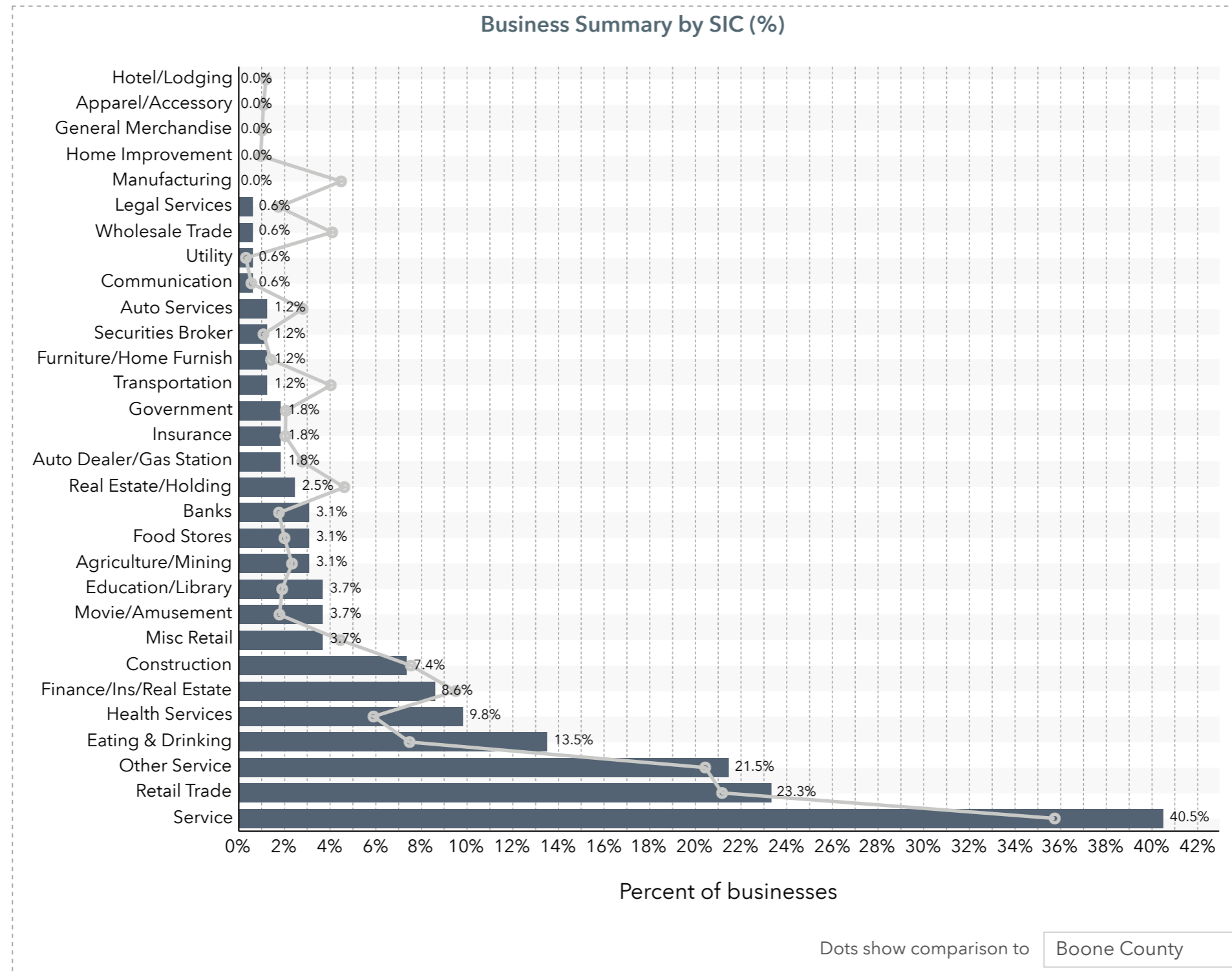
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
